In a joint presentation with Cupron, Richmond, VA, representatives of Shared Hospital Services, Portsmouth, VA, summarized the role of laundry processing of Cupron medical linens as part of a trial to measure the impact of copper-infused textiles on reducing hospital-acquired infections (HAIs).
